### Dear Parents, Guardians, and Educators,

Exact Path supplements classroom lessons by delivering learning activities that are targeted to your students' specific skills. This guide is designed to help both you and students become familiar with the Exact Path. Students might need your assistance to navigate the program.

## Logging In

### Easy Login


**Step 1:** If your teacher uses Easy Log-In, go to the web address your teacher gives you.

**Step 2:** Click on your name from the class list.



### Standard Log-In

**Step 1:** If your teacher uses standard log-in, go to <https://login.edmentum.com>.



**Step 2:** Enter the Account Login, User Name, and Password that your teacher gives you.

**Step 3:** Select the **Log in to Edmentum** button.

**Step 3:** Enter your secret code.

**Step 4:** Select the green checkmark.

**OR:** Select the ClassLink, Clever, Google or Microsoft button to log in.




## My Tests

Your Exact Path adventure might start with a diagnostic test. A test is like a thermometer: it takes your temperature to see where you are in your learning adventure.

The tests help to decide what you will learn in your learning paths. If your teacher wants you to take a test, you will see the **My Tests** page when you first log in. Select **Start** to begin a test.

## Learning Paths


Learning paths are personalized learning plans made just for you. You will have up to three learning paths. One for Reading, one for Math, and one for Language Arts. Everyone's learning paths are different.

**Learning Paths** contain activities for you to complete. You practice what you learn and improve your skills. You must complete each activity to move to the next one.




## Find Your Learning Paths



This is the screen you see when you log in. The **Reading**, **Language Arts** and **Math** buttons take you to your learning paths.

Pick the subject your teacher wants you to work on.



This is an example of one skill on a **Math** learning path. The section at the top tells you what skill you will be learning.

The **glowing marker** shows where you are on the path. It moves to the next spot each time you complete an activity.

Select the **play** button to start the activity.

## What Activities Look Like

Each activity will look a little different. Here's what some of them look like.



## Lessons

Lessons come first. They teach you something new. Press **Start** or **Play** to begin the lesson. As part of the lesson, you will answer some questions to check your understanding.

## Practices



Practices come next. They start with a reminder of what you learned in the lesson. Then you will answer some questions to practice what you are learning. Listen closely to what the question is asking you to do. You can press the **speaker buttons** if you need to hear the question or answers again. Select the **done** button to submit your answers.

## Progress Checks

Progress Checks come last. You are given questions about the skill you have been learning. Questions and answer choices are read to you. You can press the **speaker buttons** if you need to hear them again. You can also **click on any sentence to hear it read aloud** - your teacher can help you to find the **Select to Speak button** in the **Reader Tools** bar. Select the **Submit** button to submit your answer and see the next question. Score 80% or higher to earn a trophy! Then you can move on to the next skill in your learning path.

## Navigating

At the end of each activity, you will see this screen. Choose the big **arrow in the middle** of the screen to move to your next activity. Or, select the **Learning Path** button in the top right corner to go back to your learning path.







## My Rewards & Challenges

### My Rewards

The **My Rewards** button takes you to see all the things you have won.


On the My Rewards page, there are buttons for all the different types of rewards you can earn: **trophies, badges,** and sometimes **medals.**






## Trophies

You earn trophies by mastering skills in your learning paths. For a quick view of trophies earned **during this school year**, see the trophy count at the top of the screen on any page (except the home screen).




Find the trophies and badges you've earned for **all time** in the **My Rewards** area. Click the **Trophies** button to see all your trophies. When you click on your trophy, you will see some information about what you did to earn it.



## Badges

You earn badges by completing challenges set by your teacher. To see all the badges you've earned for all time, go to the **My Rewards** page and select the **Badges** tile. Just like with Trophies, you can click on any badge to find some information about what you did to earn it.





## Challenges

You can check if you have any challenges by looking at the **My Rewards** page.

At the bottom of the page, you can see a section that says **Challenges In Progress**.

Each challenge has a progress tracker so you can see how close you are to finishing.

Click on a challenge to find out what your teacher wants you to do.






## Medals (if applicable)

If your school also uses Standards Mastery Assignments, you may see **medals** in the My Rewards area. You earn medals by completing the assignments by answering at least 70% of the questions correctly (for example 7 out of 10 questions). To see all the medals you've earned for all time, go to your **My Rewards** page and select the **Medals** tile.

Just like with Trophies and Badges, you can click on any medal to find some information about what you did to earn it.




## From My Teacher

### My Work

Your teacher might give you some work in addition to your learning paths. Completing it helps boost your understanding and feel confident about the skills you are learning.

You can see it in **From My Teacher**. If you see a **dot**, it means there is new work for you to complete.


Choose the **My Work** button. Click an assignment. Then press the **Open**, **Start** or **Continue** button to work on your assignments.






## My Messages

Go to **My Messages** to read notes and announcements from your teacher. Your messages look like this. You can send messages to your teacher from here too.



## Time on Task


To see how long you have been working on your learning paths this week, select the **Clock** icon from the menu. The pop up tells you how much time you have spent in each of your subjects. It does not count how long you have spent completing diagnostic tests or My Work.





## Translation


You can translate words and phrases into another language. In your Lesson or Practice, choose the **Translate** button from the sidebar. Your teacher can help you to put words into the bar and select your language. Click Translate to see the result.
